Spotlight on: Attendance

Attendance plays a crucial role in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our children. As we prioritise the protection and development of our pupils, we would like to emphasise the significance of regular and punctual attendance.

Regular school attendance not only ensures that children have access to valuable educational opportunities but also allows us to provide the necessary care, support, and guidance they require to thrive academically and socially. When children are present in school, we can monitor their progress, address their individual needs, and foster a sense of belonging within our school community. The attendance of each child is monitored closely and our Attendance Policy is followed.

We are committed to working closely with families to address any attendance concerns and provide the necessary support. At times this may need to involve the support of the Legal Intervention Team if there are 10 or more unauthorised absences within a period of 100 days.

The LIT process ensures families are offered support prior to legal action being taken, where this is appropriate. Supporting children and families to re-engage with education in the first instance would be the primary consideration.

Our Safeguarding Audit

Our Safeguarding Audit has been updated throughout the year and we have continued to meet our actions. Our new actions are based on:

Continued regular CPD for teachers and teaching assistants.

To ensure Safeguarding reports are written for every month which is shared with the Safeguarding Governor and the DDSLs.

Increasing the research base when completing the reports particularly for the DSL and the DDSLs.

Ensuring that all children have a trusted adult to talk to. Use of collective worships to ensure that this the reality for all children.

Reviewing the low-level concern policy on a termly basis linked to safeguarding training.

Ensuring our filtering and monitoring is updated inline with **Keeping Children Safe In Education 2023 (KCSIE 2023)**

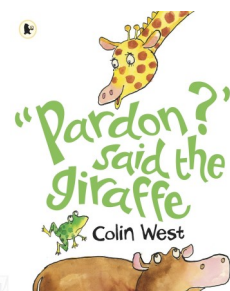
Thank you to all the children who have been sharing

Some information has been included below in response to an incident that happened in News recently:

If packed lunches are provided safe practices for foods are based around the size of food items, food allergens etc,

Small round food, such as grapes and cherry tomatoes are cut lengthways and into quarters.

Large fruit and vegetables such as melon, or apple and carrot are cut into longer thinner slices instead of small chunks
