This Week:

Welcome back to the summer half term and I hope you all had a lovely break last week. We are all now looking forward to some sunshine and warmth as we approach the end of the academic year!

It has been lovely to see the children again. I have particularly enjoyed hearing the children's contributions during Collective Worship. At Andrews' Endowed we use an ABCQ strategy to develop oracy. The Answer, Build, Challenge, Question allows the children to show their thoughts to other children's ideas. They are developing their understanding of how to develop their conversations further.

Uniform

Thank you to families for working with the school and dressing their child/children in the correct uniform. Uniform letters will be sent home with children, who are not wearing the correct uniform. For safety reasons, the children should not be wearing any earrings that are bigger than plain studs. They are unsafe as a result of children playing games during play times and lunch times as well as during PE sessions. I wanted to particularly emphasise the following aspects of the uniform: Shoulder length hair should be tied up: children shouldn't wear jewellery to school including rings, bracelets or necklaces; nail polish shouldn't be worn to school.

Hot Weather

As the hotter days come in, the children should bring a sun hat everyday. Sun cream should be applied before school if required. The children should also be bringing their water bottles everyday.

Summer Fair

The Andrews' Endowed Summer Fair is happening on Saturday 17th June. I am hoping lots of people will be able to be a part of this community event. We will also be welcoming our new Acorns who will start at Andrews' in September. They will be wearing special badges so we can all welcome them to our school. If you have any plants that you are able to donate to the Summer Fair for Gardening Club to sell then please bring them into the office. If we could kindly request no donations of tomato plants.

Stamps

Royal Mail have added barcodes to all their regular stamps. Regular stamps without a barcode* will no longer be valid after 31 July 2023. This follows the introduction of a 6 month grace period from the initial 31 January deadline. If you have any non-barcoded stamps that you no longer need then we would be grateful for them as we can swap them for the new barcoded ones.

Spotlight: Attendance

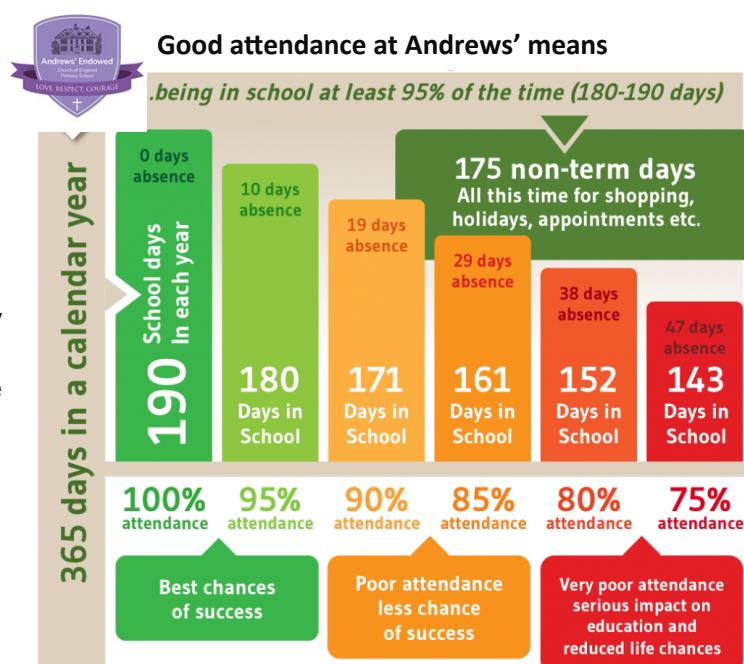
Being around teachers and friends in school is the best way for pupils to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extra-curricular opportunities and pastoral care. That's why school attendance is so important and why the Government and Andrews' is committed to tackling the issues that might cause some children to miss school unnecessarily.

How does attendance affect outcomes for pupils?

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

Research has found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well. The data also shows that in 2019, primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.



DID YOU KNOW? A two week holiday in term time means that the highest attendance you can achieve is 94.7%

Acorns - Maths—learning about doubles.

Year 1 - Phonics—we played a game in phonics to see if the phonemes blended to make a word.

Clean Air Scooter Challenge—All week
