The best possible scenario for us would be if every child in Acorns, Y1 and Y2 took a school lunch on census day. We would obviously be delighted if each child ate and enjoyed their meal, but if you are in any doubt that your child will manage we do not mind if you send your child in with a back-up packed lunch as well. We do hope that you are able to help us out on this. Our budget is incredibly stretched. Thank you for your help. **Please note that the Thursday menu will be Pizza and Roast Beef and the Wednesday menu will be Quorn pieces in a Yorkshire pudding or Ham Carbonara.**


photograph, writing a story, doing some research or showing their exploration of the artist in uniquely creative ways.
