- Year 6—Maths—completing maths videos and helping to think about the steps in the learning.


Politeness and Courtesy

Kooth is a free online counselling and emotional wellbeing platform providing young people aged 11-25 years (up to 26th birthday) in Hampshire, Southampton and Isle of Wight with a safe and secure means of accessing anonymous support, with no referral.



Kooth provides online chat sessions with

qualified counsellors, articles and tips from other young people, moderated discussion boards on specific topics and issues, and structured self-care activities. Young people can sign up online at kooth.com, independently or with the support of their teacher or tutor.
