PUPILS MAY KNOW AND WILL BUILD ON KNOWLEDGE BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:

Know the Big story of the Bible and the Big Frieze

Know the Old Testament story of the People of God.

The story of Moses and the Exodus shows God rescued his people from slavery in Egypt; Christians see this story as looking forward to how Jesus' death and resurrection also rescue people from slavery to sin.

Christians apply this idea to living today by trying to serve God and to bring freedom to others; for example, loving others, caring for them, bringing health, food, justice, and telling the story of Jesus.

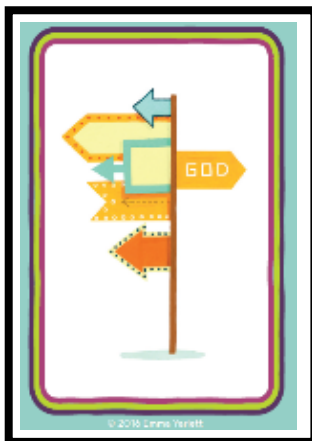

Vocabulary

Freedom	Not being in prison; the power or right to act, speak, or think as you want.
Justice	the quality of being fair and reasonable.
Slavery	a condition of having to work very hard without getting money or appreciation.
Resurrection	(in Christian belief) the rising of Christ from the dead.
Exodus	a mass departure of people. The departure of the Israelites from Egypt.
Courageous advocacy	Standing up for those who cannot stand up for themselves due to circumstances.
Commandments	rules to be observed as strictly. God gave the rules to Moses known as the Ten Commandments.
Salvation:	A way of of being saved from harm, ruin, or loss. Christians believed Jesus was the way of being saved from sin and restored to a relationship with God
reconciliation	to restore or bring back friendly relations.
