SEN ROAD MAP

Class teachers, supported by the senior leadership team, make regular assessments of progress for all pupils. These seek to identify pupils making less than expected progress given their age and individual circumstances.

Does your child need SEN support?

The school talks to you about this and talks to your child about their learning.

If you think your child may need SEN support you should talk to your child's teacher or SENCo.

Where a pupil is identified as having SEN, our school takes action to remove barriers to learning and put effective special educational provision in place.

Gaining advice from a specialist teaching or health professional Assessing your child's needs, so that we can give the right support. Discussing your child's needs with you.
