Each family's needs are different. We truly appreciate that home learning can be challenging for everyone. We do not want adults or children to feel stressed. Please feel free to choose to do what suits your child and your family best. We love hearing about all the things our children are experiencing – baking, den-building, creative artwork, nature walks and learning new skills such as riding a bike without stabilisers.

When we are finally open again, we will be able to work out where our children are in their learning, and we will be able to get everyone back on track.

The most important thing for us has always been that the children remain as happy and as safe as they can be whilst they are at home. When we re-open, whenever that may be, we will take whatever time is necessary to help our children re-adjust.
