The class teachers have made a start on phoning each and every learner in their class, just checking in and ensuring the children know we haven't forgotten them! Rest assured that they will call you to arrange to speak to your child in due course. Please feel free to put the call on speaker phone, and make sure that an adult stays in the room during the call.

As you are probably aware, today should have been the last day of the spring term, and the next two weeks are, in the calendar at least, the Easter Holidays.

We have taken the decision to still post some new work on the Home Learning Pages for each class, so that families who want the structure can continue. 
Celebrating Easter

- Divine Chocolate National Poetry Competition with some great prizes!


