Yesterday, they participated in our first ever virtual Leavers' Assembly, with the two Year 6 bubbles linked with me over Google Meet. The Assembly contained a very moving video created by Mr Paine with contributions from every child, including their memories from their time here, and their hopes for the future. They were presented with our traditional gifts, and they also received two unique gifts from the staff. Mr Paine made each child a framed Wordart of their name, surrounded by words describing their characteristics, and Mrs Gundry made each child a Treasure Box with their own image carefully inked on top. You will receive a book, which you should recognise, as it is the one you chose, and which was bought for you by the PTFA. 

<u>Curriculum Enrichment - A Year to Remember!</u>

Before lock down, the children enjoyed a whole range of wide and varied curriculum experiences. Visits were made to Calshot, RHS Wisley, Milestones Museum, Windsor Castle, Winchester Science Centre, ThinkSafe!, Butser Farm and Hillier Gardens. We participated in Remembrance Day Parades, we enjoyed rehearsing and performing our Nativity and Carols Round the Tree. We dressed up and celebrated our 300th Anniversary with costumes and biscuits and cake and balloons and a special appearance on the BBC News! There were parties and a swimming gala and sports events, we made Book Jars for World Book Day, we hosted pigs again in the secret garden, watched ducks and chicks hatch, and enjoyed Forest School. Since lock down we have become experts in Google Classroom, and we've learned to keep in touch in more creative ways. We've loved sharing in the children's learning of life skills and been impressed by the number of children who can now bake, and cook, or ride a bike, or appreciate nature, or sew or paint or knit. We have loved reading the children's work online, and seeing photos of their amazing creations.

We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back in September, and starting a whole new year of memories.

Autumn Term 2020 School Lunches

The cost for school lunches for the first half of the Autumn Term is £84 (35 lunches) or £12 per week. Although you can pay on a daily basis our preferred payment would be on a weekly basis or paying a half term in advance. If your child is ill, on a trip or decide they don't want a lunch the credit would be carried over to the following week. At this time we would prefer that all payments are made via SCOPAY as we do not want to be handling cash in the office and making weekly trips to the bank. If you have yet to try this method of paying please give it a go and don't hesitate to contact us if you are having difficulties or you have forgotten your log in details. If you are continuing to pay cash/cheque please can you ensure that all dinner money is put in a sealed envelope and clearly marked with your child's name and the amount enclosed and sent in via your child's class teacher and is paid in advance of the meal being taken.

As you are aware lunches for KS2 will be served in their classroom with their lunch in a box. This has worked extremely well over the Summer Term. There may be occasions when the meal won't work in a box and will be adapted accordingly but we will notify you of the change the week before. KS1 will have their lunch in the school hall.

Music Lessons

We hope to restart lessons at some stage in September but will advise at the start of term once we have had confirmation from HMS. For those children wanting to start in September, Mrs White will be in touch with you at the start of the Autumn Term to advise when your child can have a trial lesson.

Inhalers

Just a reminder to return all inhalers to the school on **Monday 7**th **September.** These must be handed to the class teacher in the morning ideally in the zippy wallet that you took them home in. For those children currently in school there is a new Consent Form to be completed and returned in the zippy wallet but for those currently not in school Mrs White will send home a new "Administration of Medicine consent form" for you to complete and return on Tuesday 8th September.

Hand Soap and Hand Cream

Over the Summer term children have been bringing in various hand soaps and hand creams Each product that comes in to school has to have a COSHH sheet so we have looked at various products that are available locally. reasonable prices and can cover all skin types. In September, if your child requires their own soap or hand cream we are only able to accept the following Hand creams: Aveeno, E45, Vaseline Intensive Care, Neutrogena, Palmers cocoa butter or Nivea. We have changed our school soap which is now less astringent, but if after a few weeks your child needs to bring their own, please select from the following Hand soap: Nivea moisture rich, Carex Antibacterial, Waitrose essential hand wash, The Collection from Sainsbury's - original or honey. If your child has a prescribed hand soap/cream this is okay to bring in but it must be in the original box with the child's prescription. All items must be new and in their original bottles and not decanted. They need to have a clear name label on and must remain in school in the classroom. Above all, if you could help us to encourage your child to dry the backs of their hands and not just the fronts, some of the difficulties would be resolved without additional products.

Cool Milk Scheme

We will be restarting Cool Milk in September so please don't forget if you would like your child to receive milk in school your child must be registered with Cool Milk. You can apply on line at www.coolmilk.com or by paper application (copies held in the school office). You must register your child by Tuesday 2nd September 5pm to start receiving at the start of the Autumn Term. If you have any guestions regarding this you can contact Cool Milk directly on 0844 854 2913. If your child is in Acorns and under 5 they will receive milk FREE but you must ensure that your child is registered **before** their 5th birthday if you wish your child to continue with milk.
