Challenge 1:

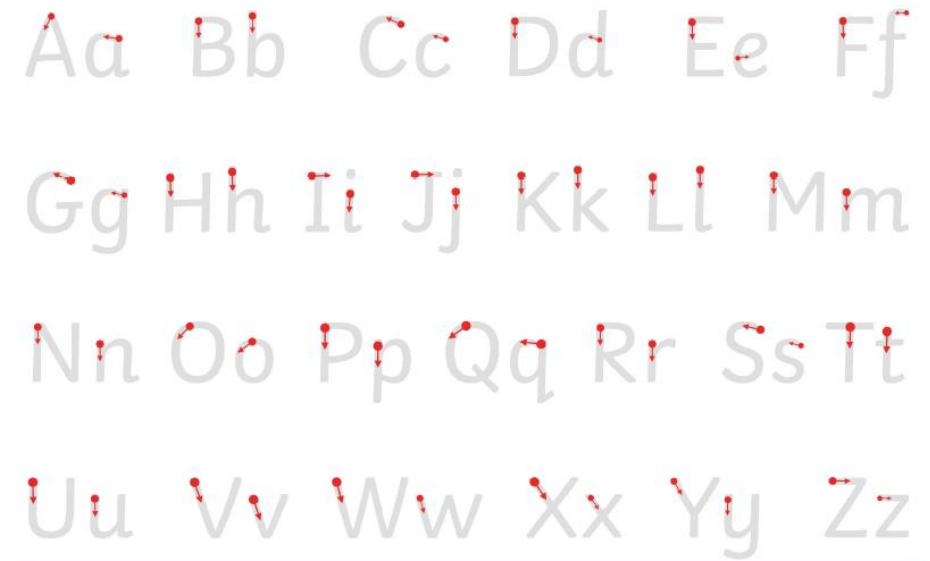
Choose 3-4 letters from the alphabet which you find tricky to form. Can you form them in sand, flour or using playdoh? Then have a go at writing 5 of each.
