#### Year 1

## Reading:

SPRING 1

- Make inferences on the basis of what is being said and done

### Writing:

- Use –ing, -er and –ed, where no change is needed in the spelling of root words
- Sequence sentences to form short narratives
- Begin to punctuate sentences using a question mark
- Write a compound sentence using the coordinating conjunction 'and'



# Number and place value:

• count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number

**MATHEMATICS** 

- given a number, identify one more and one less
- identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least
- count in 2s
- count in 5s

#### Addition and subtraction:

- read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs
- add and subtract one digit

<sup>\*</sup>GPCs - this is short for Grapheme Phoneme Correspondence. Knowing a GPC means being able to match a phoneme (sound) to a grapheme (a letter or a number of letters that represent a sound (phoneme) in a word and vice versa.
